As the Federal Government continue to sell off all our Government assets to Private Enterprise we find hefty price increases follow and this directly affects our Pensioner rate buying power. We personally feel that Australian Pensioners have become the whipping boys for the Government in its efforts to save money and balance their budget.

For example Meat prices continue to rise, as does Bread, Milk and other staple foods. Our pension dollar buys so much less today.
