I would like to thank you for bringing Forgotten Australians fight for justice to attention once again.

I have since 2005 been fighting for justice against the NSW State government to try and break statue of limitations.

I have been traumatized and messed around by a firm of solicitors that were on a pro bono basis. There were about 40 Forgotten Australians that used this firm in NSW and have been traumatized once again by there believing someone would fight for our rights to try and make this government accountable for there past abuse . This firm was recommended by ARC.

My fight was to have my days in court that is why this case was taken on no other reason. My last appointment was on in December 2009 and I asked if I could tape it so I could listen after and comprehend what was said and did so.

After 5years when asked by the solicitor what I wanted out of this and I replied “My day in court” the solicitor replied “ Sorry about that it is not going to happen we just want this settled out of court.” Of cause my health took me down mentally and physically.

I have since payed \$80 for my files, mostly of what I had sent the solicitors and the correspondence they had sent me over those years.

I received a letter from that solicitor firm saying they had on numerous occasions suggesting I and others do victims compensation. No where in my files at home or what I picked up and just payed for is there any thing suggesting any thing about victims compensation.

I hope that no other Forgotten Australian goes down this road again and has to go through what so many others have experienced.
