## INQUIRY INTO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE LOST INNOCENTS AND FORGOTTEN AUSTRALIANS REPORTS

## **Terms of Reference**

30 August 2008 was the 7<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the tabling in the Senate of the *Lost Innocents* report and the 4<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the tabling of the *Forgotten Australians* report. The Community Affairs Committee agreed that it was time to update progress with the responses to its recommendations in these reports.

On 18 September 2008, on the motion of the Committee Chair, Senator Moore, the Senate referred the following matter to the Community Affairs Committee for inquiry and report by the last sitting day in March 2009:

Progress with the implementation of the recommendations in the reports by the Community Affairs References Committee, *Lost Innocents: Righting the Record*, a report on child migration tabled in August 2001, and *Forgotten Australians*, a report on Australians who experienced institutional or out-of-home care as children tabled in August 2004.

The Senate has agreed to extend the reporting date to the 25 June 2009
