I wish to reinforce the concerns of our representative body, The Franchise Council of Australia (FCA), regarding emotional and inaccurate statements that have been made in Federal Parliament and in State inquiries regarding alleged conduct in the Australian franchising sector.

The FCA has made well-researched and considered submissions to the WA and SA inquiries on behalf of members. I trust the Corporations Committee will take these thorough submissions into account during the inquiry, rather than rely on the emotive and inflammatory hearsay which has been presented in the House of Representatives recently.

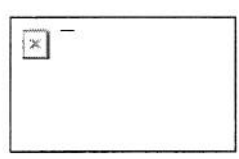

Trying to change the rules in the ways suggested in Parliament recently will, in my view, only serve to undermine the whole sector – to the detriment of franchisors and franchisees.
