APPENDIX 5: STATISTICS ON MUSEUMS AND ART GALLERIES

GENERAL ADMISSION CHARGE

Extracts from Spring J, *Museums 1993: art museums, museums and public galleries in Australia*, Australia Council research paper no. 12, May 1994:

[The scope of the survey was museums and public art galleries ('art museums') which have paid staff - about 271 in Australia in 1993 (a further seven were excluded from survey as being temporarily closed or only just opened). 198 questionnaires were returned. 'Larger' museums/galleries are those with 20 or more staff; 'regional' museums/galleries are those with less than 20 staff.]

'Of the 198 survey respondents, 50 per cent levy a general admission charge. It is a more common practice with museums than for art museums. Art museums however frequently charge an entry fee to individual exhibitions. A few museums charge entry to their branches, but not the main museum site. These have been recorded as a "no entry charge".'

Definitions:

'art museums': includes public art galleries with no permanent collection but operating as exhibition galleries.

'national/ state' museums/ art museums:

1988-89 = the group accepted as national or state through membership of the Council of Australian Art Museum Directors or the Council of Australian Museum Directors, being mainly capital city institutions funded primarily by Commonwealth or State governments.

1989-90 = 'primarily funded by Commonwealth or State governments' or 'having a current expenditure over \$1.1million'.

'larger' museums/ art museums:

1990-91 to 1992-93: = those with 20 or more paid staff

1993-94, 1994-95: = those with 30 or more paid staff

The extent to which the definitions of the earlier 'national/ state' group and the later 'larger' group are co-extensive is not quite clear from the source documents, but the fact that the numbers involved are similar suggests that they are co-extensive or almost so.

'local/regional/private' museums/ art museums (1988-89 & 1989-90): those with paid staff, other than 'national/ state'.

'regional' museums/ art museums (1990-91 onwards): those with paid staff, other than 'larger', that is, those with 1-19 staff (1990-91 to 1992-93) or 1-29 staff (1993-94 & 1994-95).

'admissions': includes regular door charges and charges for special exhibitions or special events. (pers. comm. W. Woodward, Australia Council, 1998)

'government' funding: includes not only direct government grants but also indirect subvention such as through universities, government departments or semi-government authorities.

'private sector support': called 'sponsorship, donations, bequests' 1988-89. It appears, though it is not explicit, that these terms are intended to be co-extensive.

From 1988-89 to 1990-91 n shows the number of valid responses to the survey questionnaire. From 1991-92 on, n shows the estimated number of institutions in the relevant group, and figures are estimated totals for the group extrapolating from survey responses. The discontinuity in figures for the 'regional' group between 1990-91 and 1991-92 reflects their lower response rate.
