Clearly the current funding arrangements are well below what is necessary to maintain a satisfactory service. And this unfortunately has implications for its independence. A return to 1995-6 funding levels (in real terms) would seem adequate.

The current Managing Director & Board no longer enjoy my confidence as a shareholder. In an organisation such as the ABC morale is exceedingly important. Under the current regime this appears to have deteriorated drastically, contributing to the problems we now see and hear.

I would like to see a new system of appointment for Board members to ensure impartiality; appointments being made on merit & support of the ABC's independence.
