To. Senate ECITA References Committee.

I would ask the Senate to think deeply about Australia's present and future participation in the Uranium Mining industry.

At present we have a Uranium Mine bordering a National Park i.e. Kakadu, in a significant wetlands area with a monsoonal climate. It sounds ridiculous and it is. - ④ We should incorporate the strictest environmental standards possible to protect the future well being of our country and its population.

The Uranium Industry is the ultimate DIRTY industry.

And the most DANGEROUS industry.

It should not be taken lightly.
