The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority Amendment Bill 2007

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the provisions proposed in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority Amendment Bill. The Australian Institute of Marine Science (AIMS) has over 30 years experience in conducting research on the Great Barrier Reef. More recently this has included investigating the impact of increased impact on the Reef's ecosystem caused by runoff (water quality) and rising sea surface temperature (coral bleaching).

Broadly speaking we support the Bill in that it recognises the critical role of the Authority in managing the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park. One area of concern is the provision which establishes a timeframe of at least 7 years before zoning can be changed. This does not allow for an adaptive management approach that will be required as climate change impacts, and possible other impacts, cause increased stress on the ecosystem. A maximum period should be 5 years.

Overall the Bill is supported by AIMS especially the 5-yearly outlook report which is a positive step. We support this provision noting the importance of making the reporting and review process transparent and the need to ensure the report is a public document.
