## INQUIRY INTO AUSTRALIA'S NATIONAL PARKS

I enclose for your deliberations a set of journal articles, two books and several reports on the topic of tourism in Australia's national parks.

In summary, Australia's protected area agencies still feel the pinch of increasing visitor demand, increasing external pressures on protected environments, and increasing financial pressures on their own management capabilities.

One issue of critical current concern is the severe reduction in Commonwealth Government funding for World Heritage management. There seems to be endless buck-passing between EA, State National parks agencies and CMAs.

I have argued in the past for certain areas of State Forest to be used for tourism and conservation rather than logging. In practice, forestry agencies have adopted tourism, but without reducing logging, and have surrendered certain areas to parks agencies, but only after logging and roading them first.

Over recent years, the National Heritage Trust has funded regional catchment management authorities to provide conservation works on private land. The actual conservation outcomes are not known but it appears that some of these funds at least, have not been very well used.

Conservation on private land, however – especially areas adjacent to national parks – will become increasingly critical in future, and NHT3, if it proceeds, needs much closer control and scrutiny. I enclose copies of recent correspondence with the Prime Minister and others regarding possible incentive mechanisms.
