Our submission to this enquiry is classified under Term of Reference "c". Any threats to the objectives and management of our national parks, other conservation reserves and marine protected areas.

There is a massive threat to the Towra Point Reserve in Botany Bay, NSW. This Reserve is protected under the Ramsar agreement as a wetland of international significance. The threat is the expansion of Port Botany by the NSW government.
