The Space Activities Amendment Bill 2002

On 26 June 2000, the Senate referred the above Bill to the Senate Economics Legislation Committee for inquiry and report by 20 August.

The main purpose of the inquiry is:

- to consider the basis for the \$750m cap on liability insurance;
- to consider the rationale for the Federal Government's commitment to insure for amounts above \$750m up to \$3b;
- to consider the adequacy of the 3.75 billion dollar total liability insurance coverage;
- to assess the methodology used in arriving at total liability insurance coverage;
 and
- to assess whether a Regulatory Impact Statement needs preparation considering the extent of the Government's Financial commitment.
