Dear Sir/Madam,

I would like to express my concern on the damage caused to myself and hundreds of other tax payers in Australia, by the inequity of the Government having identified defects in the law and claimed to fix them for the future. This leaves people, like myself, unprotected and affected by the defects in the self-assessment system.

After a lengthy process of objecting to the disallowance of a deduction I had claimed, writing to the Ombudsman, lengthy waiting periods for his judgment on it and then simply wiping his hands over the situation to then applying to the A.A.T. to find out they could not help me, I finally conceded defeat and paid the tax bill, reluctantly.

I had excessive GIC imposed upon me and have suffered loss, stress and financial difficulties.

The treasury has recommended that a new law be imposed but I am excluded from its benefits. I deserve to be protected by changes in legislation which have affected me in the past.

Please have the legislation amended to be effective from the commencement of self-assessment.
