## Dear Sir/Madam

I have a concern regarding that one of the conditions to be able to be a BAS provider is being able to substantiate 1400hours BAS hours over 3 years
(1400 divided by 3yrs $=466.66666$ divided by 48 weeks (presuming 4 weeks Annual Leave) $=9.722222$ per week.

- Most BAS are done per quarter which means that in the month they are due you would have to complete approx 116 hours. This is approx 29 hours per week just on BAS. People would find it hard to survive on income if they relied only on BAS processing as they usually do bookkeeping, consulting \& training in the same period.
- It does not include any of the actual data entry. (If you do the Bookkeeping you are self checking all the time)
- What about people who wish to work part- time?
- If new to Bookkeeping and wish to be a BAS provider how do you get to the 1400 hours if you are not legally allowed to process a BAS
