# Inquiry into workforce challenges in the Transport Industry

The National Centre for Vocational Education Research (NCVER) is in the business of collecting, analysing and broking information about vocational education and training (VET). The organisation is responsible for collecting and managing national VET provider and New Apprenticeship statistics, and managing national surveys of graduates and students, and employers' views of training. We undertake a strategic program of research, and collect and provide VET research findings from Australian and international sources through the Vocational Education and Training Research Database (VOCED).

## RESPONSE TO TERMS OF REFERENCE

In response to this inquiry, NCVER provides references to research from our managed research program and data from our statistical collections in response to the second term of reference: *Industry needs and the skills profile of the current workforce*.

## Industry needs and the skills profile of the current workforce

### Research

Data, both quantitative and qualitative, were gathered from 150 enterprises in five industry sectors, including transport, using targeted interviews, focus groups, a mailed questionnaire survey, and a telephone interview survey to ascertain the level of importance employers place on their employees' qualifications: whether employers value qualifications differently by type of employee (eg new or existing), job classification and enterprise, the types of competence for which formal qualifications are valued, and the decision-making processes they adopt.

The results suggest that stakeholders outside the formal education and training system, particularly employers, value qualifications less than those stakeholders inside the system. Large and smaller enterprises both distinguished between formal qualifications and relevant experience. They both sought outcomes from training (and assessment) consistent with their perception of business needs and how competence contributes to satisfying those needs (including minimising risks).

## Data

Following is data from NCVER's statistical collections on vocational education and training statistics, apprentice and trainee statistical collection, the Student Outcomes Survey, and the Survey of Employers' Use and Views of the VET system.

Specifically, data relevant to the transport industry is provided on:

- Apprentices and trainees
- Vocational education and training (VET) students and courses
- Outcomes from VET
- Employers' use and views of VET

In some sections, data is included on training related to storage occupations and industries.

## **Apprentices and trainees**

### Data description

• An apprentice or trainee is a person undertaking vocational training through a contracted training arrangement.

#### Information is shown for:

- Commencements in apprenticeships and traineeships over 12 months ending 30 June
- Apprentices and trainees in-training at 30 June
- Completions in apprenticeships and traineeships over 12 months ending 30 June.

#### Key findings on apprentices and trainees

Tables one to five provide information on apprenticeships and traineeships occupation outcomes in transport and storage (as defined in Appendix A). Key findings are:

- Overall, the numbers of apprentices and trainees in-training at 30 June and commencements over 12 months to 30 June have declined for apprentices and trainees in transport and storage occupations between 2002 and 2006.
- The number of apprenticeship and traineeship commencements in transport and storage occupations over 12 months ending 30 June 2006 was 20 200
  - The majority were male (86%), compared to 59% of all apprenticeship and traineeship commencements over 12 months to June 2006.
  - The majority were over 25 years (81%), compared to 42% of all apprenticeship and traineeship commencements over 12 months to June 2006.
  - Over half were existing workers (54%), compared to 26% of all apprenticeship and traineeship commencements over 12 months to June 2006.
  - The majority were training in AQF certificate III qualifications (91%), compared to 71% of all apprenticeship and traineeship commencements over 12 months to June 2006.
- The number of apprentices and trainees in-training within transport and storage occupations at 30 June 2006 was 26 600
- The number of apprenticeship and traineeship completions in transport and storage occupations over 12 months ending 30 June 2006 was 13 800

Tables six to eight provide information on apprenticeships and traineeships in the transport industry, based on the industry of the apprentices' or trainees' employer (as defined in Appendix B). Key findings are:

- Overall, the numbers of apprentices and trainees in-training at 30 June and commencements over 12 months to 30 June have declined for apprentices and trainees with employers assigned to the transport industry between 2002 and 2006.
- The number of apprenticeship and traineeship commencements in the transport industry over 12 months ending 30 June 2006 was 14 200
- The number of apprentices and trainees in-training in the transport industry at 30 June 2006 was 19 800
- The number of apprenticeship and traineeship completions in the transport industry over 12 months ending 30 June 2006 was 8 700.

Tables nine to twelve provide information on apprentices and trainees undertaking training in training packages relevant to transport and storage (as defined in Appendix C). (A more detailed breakdown of apprentices and trainees in-training in transport related training package qualifications between 2002 and 2006 is at Appendix D). The figures show that:

- Overall, the numbers of apprentices and trainees in-training at 30 June and commencements over 12 months to 30 June have declined for transport and storage related training packages between 2002 and 2006.
- The most popular transport and storage related training package qualification for apprentices and trainees in-training at 30 June 2006 and for commencements over 12 months ending 30 June 2006 was AQF certificate III in Transport and Distribution.

## Vocational education and training: Students and Courses

#### Data description

This section provides information about all students and courses relevant to transport and storage<sup>1</sup>. Information is shown for VET student enrolments and VET qualifications completed between 2001 and 2005.

### Key findings on VET student enrolments

Tables 13 to 16 provide information on student enrolments in VET programs classified to transport and storage occupations (as defined in Appendix A). Student enrolments in VET programs oriented for skills towards the transport and storage industry increased from 41 300 in 2001 to 44 400 in 2003 and have since declined to 40 300 in 2005.

Overall between 2001 and 2005, student enrolments in courses with a transport and storage orientation grew considerably for AQF certificate III qualifications, females and courses with skills assigned to the occupations of seafarers and fishing hands and store persons. Declines over the past five years were reported for AQF certificate I or II qualifications, males and courses with assigned occupations in sea transport professionals and automobile drivers. During 2005, of the 40 300 students enrolled in VET programs that were oriented for skills towards transport and storage occupations:

- Over a third (37%) were enrolled in courses classified to road and rail transport drivers not further defined occupations and just under a third (31%) were classified to store persons occupations.
- Almost half (46%) were enrolled in AQF certificate III qualifications. By contrast, 27% of total VET students in 2005 were enrolled in AQF certificate III qualifications.
- The majority were aged 25 years or over (76%). By contrast, 57% of total VET students in 2005 were aged 25 years or over.
- The majority were male (87%). By contrast, 52% of total VET students in 2005 were male.

Tables 17 and 18 provide student enrolments in Training Package qualification relevant to the transport industry (as defined in Appendix C). Training packages relevant to the transport industry include the Transport and Distribution, first endorsed in 1997, and the Maritime and Aviation, introduced 2001 and 2003 respectively.

In 2005, 38 100 students were enrolled in training packages relevant to the transport industry. The most popular training package qualification was AQF certificate III in Transport and Distribution (see Appendix E for a more detailed breakdown of students by training package qualifications between 2001 and 2005).

## Key findings on VET qualifications completed

In 2004, 9 200 qualifications were completed in VET courses that were oriented for skills towards the transport and storage industry (see table 19).

In 2004, 9 500 qualifications were completed in training packages relevant to the transport industry (see tables 20 and 21).

# Vocational education and training outcomes

## Data description

This section provides information on students' views and outcomes on training. Data is provided for individuals employed after training in transport and storage occupations (see Appendix G for a list of the occupations).

Key findings on vocational education and training outcomes

Data from the 2005 Student Outcomes Survey (see tables 22 and 23) show:

- Graduates employed in transport occupations after training are more likely to be employed as casual workers and less likely to be permanent when compared to all employed graduates.
- Transport graduates are less likely than all employed graduates to report receiving benefits, achieving their main reason or that their job is highly or somewhat relevant to their training.
- Reasons for study and satisfaction are similar for transport graduates to all employed graduates.
- Graduates who are employed after training in transport occupations are likely to be older (25+) and male compared to all employed graduates. They are more likely to have studied a certificate II or III and less likely a diploma or higher.
- The most common fields of education of students are engineering and related technologies, and management and commerce.

### Employers' use and views of vocational education and training

### Data description

This section contains information on employers' use and views of the vocational education and training. Data is based on employers in the transport and storage industry group.

Key findings on employers' use and views of VET

The key findings shown in tables 24 to 27 on employers in the transport and storage industry are:

- A lower proportion of employers in the transport and storage industry are engaged with the VET system, compared to all employers.
- Employers in the transport and storage industry are more satisfied with nationally recognised training than all employers, but less satisfied with other aspects of the VET system.
- The proportion of employers in the transport and storage industry having recruitment difficulties is about the same as all industries.
- Difficulties in recruiting staff in the transport and storage industry and also in all industries were most often attributed to a shortage of skilled people in the industry.
