



Submission to Senate Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Reference Committee

During the last 25 years we have seen many changes to our economic systems which have been greatly influenced by large corporate organisations. This has been motivated by the want of increased profit and on the whole has not been to foster a better community either locally or globally.
