Limited concessions

TOM Amos, in his letter "Vexed veterans" (*The Advertiser*, 15/7/02), has provided well-intentioned feedback to readers concerning the recent meeting of the Veterans' Affairs Entitlement Committee in Adelaide.

However, I must say that his reference to the Veterans' Affairs Gold Card as a Gold "pass" inappropriately connotes

thoughts by people who don't know the system, that it is a free ticket.

To the contrary, the issue of a Gold Card is stringent in its eligibility and is restricted in its use for medical, dental and pharmaceutical requirements and some concessions.

The only Gold Pass I know of is given to politicians, most of whom have no idea what veterans went through to get a Gold Card.
