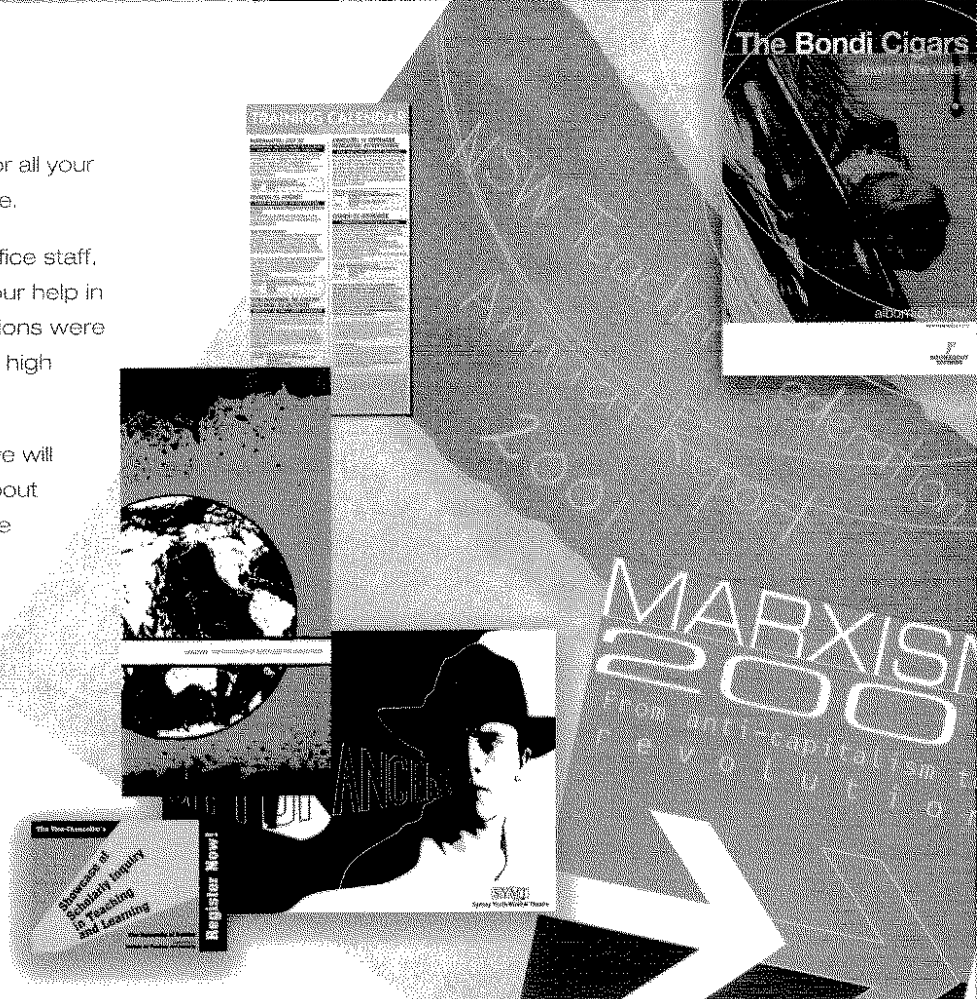


We are just writing to say thanks for all your help in 2000 and in the year to date.

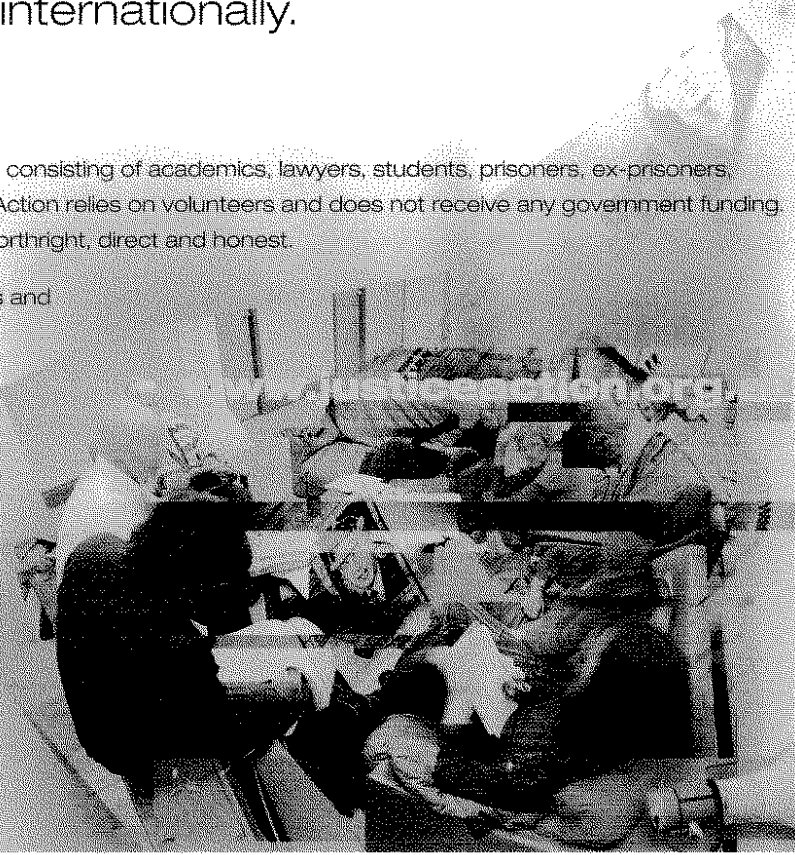
For over thirty years, Justice Action has earned the trust and respect necessary to represent prisoners' interests both nationally and internationally.

WHAT IS JUSTICE ACTION?

We are a community-based criminal justice organisation consisting of academics, lawyers, students, prisoners, ex-prisoners, victims of crime and other community activists. Justice Action relies on volunteers and does not receive any government funding. This permits a rigorous watchdog function. Our style is forthright, direct and honest.

Justice Action promotes awareness of the inadequacies and failures of the criminal justice system and actively assists those who suffer. We maintain ongoing communication with prisoners and monitor their complaints. These communications form the basis of our campaigns to prevent abuses from occurring.

Justice Action meets with Ministers, members of parliament, the Inspector-General of Corrective Services, Prisoners Legal Service and networks with other community organisations including the Council for Civil Liberties, CopWatch, the Indigenous Social Justice Association, Justice for Young People, ACON and Hepatitis C Council of NSW.



DNA DATABASING

As the only group invited to make an oral presentation to the Senate Inquiry into the Crimes (Forensic Procedures) Act in December 2000, we defended the privacy of human genetic material against the top four experts from the Attorney-General and the Federal Police.

RIGHT TO VOTE

Successfully defended the prisoners' vote nationally at the Senate Inquiry.

DRUG SUMMIT

Distributed the only questionnaire to prisoners during the Drug Summit and had six MP crossbenchers write "the participation of Justice Action is absolutely crucial to deliberations at the Summit."

ORGANISATION

Coordinated the Criminal Justice Coalition for two and a half years.

Facilitated the creation of the Australian Prisoners Union in 1999.

WELFARE WORK

Supervision of people on community service orders and a unique and highly acclaimed mentoring scheme since 1984.

Long experience in initiating and managing a half-way house with drug-dependent people coming from prisons, counselling families and prisoners directly.

Initiated the computer project, which has had over 100 computers donated from the corporate and community sector.

INTERNATIONAL

Present a substantial, ever-growing website. www.justiceaction.org.au

Hosted the International Conference on Penal Abolition (ICOPA) website and produced its first video presentation.

CONSULTATIONS

One of only two groups invited to present ideas for corrections to the premier biennial Symposium on Crime in Australia in Canberra in June 2001.

Invited by the Commissioner for ACT Corrections to participate in the planning of their new system.

PRESENTATION

Continuous media work. Produce FRAMED, the only publication distributed free to all NSW jails and now nationally through libraries and committees. It is also distributed to all NSW judges, politicians and community legal centres.

POLICE MONITORING

Forced the exposure and reform of the police "verbal".

Hosted and resourced the successful Tim Anderson campaign around the Hilton Hotel bombing.

Made presentations to the Wood Royal Commission and followed through with the exposure of miscarriages of justice.
