Senate Select Committee on the Free Trade Agreement between Australia and the United States of America ANALYSIS OF SUBMISSIONS TO THE COMMITTEE

The Senate Select Committee on the Free Trade Agreement between Australia and the United States of America (the Committee) invited individuals and organisations with knowledge and information relevant to the inquiry's terms of reference to lodge submissions. The closing date was 30 April 2004. In total, 541 submissions were received, including 2 which were confidential. The large number of submissions suggests a high level of public interest in the FTA.

The 539 submissions available on the Committee's website¹ were analysed to assess the extent of support for the FTA. Each submission was ranked on a scale of 1 to 5, from strong opposition to strong support, with a score of 3 being neutral, usually comprising submissions which provided clarification rather than support or opposition. A moderate classification was allocated to submissions with mild support or opposition, or with support or opposition with reservations. Overall, 90% of submissions opposed the FTA, 3% were neutral and 7% were supportive, as shown in the following table.

Two-thirds of submissions were from individuals. Of these 98% opposed the FTA, with 2% neutral. Only two submissions by individuals were received supporting the agreement. While opposition to the agreement might be expected, this outcome is surprising, since a significant number of industry groups supported the FTA, and this support could have extended to group members. Negative individual submissions appear to have been promoted by campaigns by two organizations. While detailed analysis has not been undertaken of this factor, it would appear to account for around 50 out of the 353 individual responses. Given the high level of individual opposition to the FTA, it is not surprising that the 37 community groups which responded were unanimously opposed to the agreement.

All 27 Union submissions were opposed to the FTA. Seven of these were brief and similar submissions made by state branches of the Australian Services Union.

Other classes of submission unanimously opposed to the agreement included environmental, political (local chapters of national parties), education establishments/groups and religious groups. State governments and statutory authorities were generally opposed, but 3 out of 11 indicated moderate support.

Companies were more supportive of the agreement, with 34% indicating strong support and 51% opposition. The car makers which made submissions were strong supporters. Companies dealing with open-source software were strong opponents, as were individual programmers, particularly those working with open source programs such as Linux.

The business group category recorded 100% support while for the agriculture industry group support (58%) exceeded opposition (42%). In the services and cultural sectors, negative submissions greatly exceeded positive.

The analysis of submissions, including rapid review of their content generates the following conclusions:

- 1. Big business is largely supportive of the FTA.
- 2. Most other classes are strongly opposed to the agreement.
- 3. The strong opposition by individuals, consumer groups and unions would suggest that a significant proportion of the Australian population does not see the FTA as being in its interest (though it is recognised that many people are likely to be apathetic)
- 4. The dominant reasons for opposition were loss of sovereignty, issues with pharmaceutical benefits, loss of cultural identity, lack of economic gains for Australia and the perceived far greater benefits to be gained by the US. The AUSFTA (and others being negotiated by the US) is quite widely considered to indicate America's increasing search for hegemony.
- 5. Many submissions stated a belief that (a) not enough time had been allowed for discussion; (b) that insufficient information had been provided to the public; and that (c) the haste to sign up by the Australian government suggested that the FTA was seen as a political issue rather than conferring major economic gains for the Australian community or business.

Only three submissions focussed on the problems relating to a conflict between bilateral agreements and multilateralism (one of which - No 8 - was by the author of this paper). One considered that such bilateral agreements would have no impact on agreements through the WTO.

The data can be summarised by deducting the level of opposition within each class from the level of support to give an indication of "net support" as shown in the graph. Overall net opposition was 84% - which is considered to be evidence of major resistance to the FTA, particularly in the light of its strong promotion by the government.


