- 8. Restrictions on Australian content rules in new media
- 9. Restrictions on Regulation of Investment and Services
- 10. Job losses from tariff cuts and changes to government purchasing rules

I vigorously oppose the USFTA and trust that the Senate Committee will make the best decision for Australia's future.
