CHAPTER 1

Referral

- 1.1 The Sex Discrimination Amendment Bill (No. 1) 2000 ('the Bill') was introduced into the House of Representatives on 17 August 2000.
- On 31 October 2000 the Selection of Bills Committee¹ agreed to refer the provisions of the Bill to the Legal and Constitutional Legislation Committee ('the Committee') for inquiry and report by 4 December 2000. On 4 December 2000 the Senate extended the reporting date until 27 February 2001.

Conduct of the Inquiry

- 1.3 The Committee wrote to a range of organisations and individuals on 2 November 2000 inviting submissions and advertised in the national press on 4 November 2000. The Committee received a total of 172 submissions. These are listed in Appendix 1. The Committee also acknowledges the receipt by email of many comments both supporting and opposing the amendments.
- 1.4 The Committee held hearings in Sydney on 20 November 2000, in Melbourne on 21 November 2000 and 13 February 2001 and in Canberra on 28 November 2000. A list of witnesses at these hearings is at Appendix 2.
- 1.5 The Committee wishes to thank all those who provided submissions and gave oral evidence.
