The Southern Cross Group has informed me that you are looking for personal submissions with regard to the above Bill.

I became a landed immigrant when I arrived in Sydney on 23 December 1973 from Canada. I stayed in Sydney to complete a 4 year degree course at the University of New South Wales. Once I completed my studies, I worked in Sydney till 5 May 1978 when I was laid off. As other work opportunities in my field were not available, I then decided to return to Canada and left Sydney on 4 June 1978. I no longer have that old Canadian passport with the relevant Australian Immigration stamp.

In early May 1978, I enquired about obtaining Australian citizenship and was told I had to be in the country for at least 6 more months from the time my application was submitted. Once I was laid off and had decided to return to Canada, I no longer had time to submit my application.

It is my hope that new Australian legislation will allow me to obtain Australian citizenship.

Beside that time in Australia, I lived in Sydney from 12 January 1963 to 2 January 1965.

My parents immigrated from Canada to Australia in 1972 and stayed there till 1990. They both obtained Australian citizenship, which were maintained.

I have occasionally worked offshore Australia in 1979, 1997, 2000, 2001, and 2002. For those times I obtained the necessary visa. I still maintain strong ties to Australia via various friends whom I visit when ever I am in the country, as well as following what is going on via the web.
