## Inquiry into the provisions of the Law and Justice Legislation Amendment (Video Link Evidence and Other Measures) Bill 2005

I am writing in response to your invitation for the AFP to make a submission to this Inquiry.

The AFP strongly supports the amendments proposed in the Law and Justice Legislation Amendment (Video Link Evidence and Other Measures) Bill 2005. Of particular importance to the AFP are the proposed amendments to:

- the Crimes Act 1914 to enable video link evidence to be used in proceedings for terrorism and related offences;
- the Foreign Evidence Act 1994 to enable other forms of evidence to be used in these proceedings where it is not possible to provide evidence by video link;
- the Crimes Act 1914 to allow the use of digital equipment to record interviews with suspects; and
- the Surveillance Devices Act 2004 to allow retrieval warrants to be used to remove tracking devices installed under an authorisation issued under section 39 of the Surveillance Devices Act 2004.
