I completely oppose the Marriage Equality Bill 2009 because I believe that it will permanently change our society in a direction from which there will be no return. I believe that children have a right to a mother and father whether they end up living with both of them or not. Both these roles play an intricate part of the development of a child to be the adults that they deserve to be.

Statistics prove that children have more problems getting through the teenage problems (eg drugs, alchohol, unplanned pregnancy, school leaving age, crime, eventual incarceration etc) when there is no father living with them.
