## Inquiry into the Rights of the Terminally III (Euthanasia Laws Repeal) Bill 2008


Thank you for the invitation to provide a submission to the Senate Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs Inquiry into the Rights of the Terminally Ill (Euthanasia Laws Repeal) Bill 2008.

The Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission ('HREOC') will not be making a formal submission to the Inquiry as HREOC has not conducted any recent work on euthanasia and human rights.

However, I would like to draw your attention to an Occasional Paper produced for HREOC in December 1996 by George Zdenkowski, then Associate Professor of Law and Director of the Human Rights Centre of the University of NSW.

The Occasional Paper sought to promote informed public discussion of issues surrounding the legal regulation of euthanasia, following the introduction of the Rights of the Terminally Ill Act 1995 (NT), and in particular the relevance of international human rights norms to that debate.
