their time of suffering. I wanted to be a person who makes a difference, someone who brightens another person's day. I know

that euthanasia works against these desires.

I do not want my job discription to include killing people, even if those people are deeply depressed, in extreme pain, very

deformed or very old. I know that if euthanasia was legalised nurses and other medical professionals most probably would

not be forced to be the one who carries out the killing most likely only medical professionals who believe in euthanasia would

be asked to perform the last act leading to death. However, I could not go to work each day, knowing that patients that ${\sf I}$

have cared for are being encouraged to believe that their last days are not worth living.

As a nurse I have seen that even patients who are very old and very deformed are able to live valuable lives. Their lives may not

be as happy or as fulfilling as they would like their lives to be but it is still a life. Even people who are young and healthy have

difficulties which hinder their hapiness and their fulfillment but that is not a reason to give up. Each of us are given a life, each

of us have obstacles to overcome but each of us still have life and that should be treasured and encouraged. That life should

not be taken away.

I know that if euthanasia was legalised I would end my nursing career because I would no longer be able to veiw nursing has an
