Questions on Notice - ACT Government

Question 1 - Senator Heffernan

How much of that congestion at the roundabout is due to the Gungahlin traffic? Hansard reference - page 64.

Answer:

Mr Simon Corbell:

The estimate on traffic movement in the vicinity of the roundabout is based on SMEC's Pialligo Origin-Destination Counts presented in the *Pialligo Avenue Upgrade Staging Proposel Report* of 4 May 2006.

The report identifies out of 1,274 vehicle movements from Majura Road (westbound), 638 (53%) go to Monaro Highway southbound and 133 (10%) to Morshead Drive westbound.

These traffic movements therefore constitute about 60%, which is the proportion that goes to the roundabout in question.

Putting this together with ACT Planning and Land Authority analysis of 55% of Majura Road traffic is from Gungahlin, it is reasonable to estimate that around 33% of the roundabout traffic comes from Gungahlin.
