

Dear Sir, The grammar is incorrect and can affect significantly the meaning of these sentences

87 line 22 - 87(1)c the fed animal will only eat the food animal if it is alive.  
This should be  
the fed animal will eat the food animal only if it is alive.

In the present writing it means the fed animal will just eat it - not tear it to bits or cry over it.

This applies to (e) as well.

In paragraph 64 (2) (g) it is legal to kill an animal and in (l) illegal to kill an animal. I think (l) should be a bit more specific as it means any animal being sent to the freezer could not be killed. While I am happy with this I think it will never pass.

I do support this bill.
