Subject: National Animal Welfare Bill

It is important to me to write on behalf of the animals who are helpless and at the mercy of a terrible inequity between the protections provided for companion animals and "livestock" or animals used in research, hunting and entertainment.

I propose:

- 1. All livestock should be free range.
- 2. Surgical mutilation of animals must cease.
- 3. Animals in feedlots/saleyards must have access to water, shelter and food.
- 4. Animals SHOULD NOT be used in research or experimentation, hunting, or any entertainment that is to their detriment.
- 5. There must be a journey time limit for animals going to slaughter.
- 6. Live export must cease.
