Submission to Inquiry into Water Policy Initiatives

- There has been enormous effort to work with the system by the floodplain occupants but no respect or acknowledgement has been given to the submissions and views of the non-irrigating water users.
- It has been proved beyond doubt that the attempts by Governments and their agencies to resolve bad administration with community consensus is never going to work.
