It appears to me as an engineer with long experience in dam construction that the decision by the State Government to go to the

Mary River for future supply is a sensible one. The Mary River rises

in one of the wettest areas in Queensland near Brisbane and has only

the one storage on this area of the catchment, the Obi Obi which serves

the Sunshine Coast and is a small part of the catchment. After the

North Pine the Mary River is the nearest usable catchment to Brisbane

in Queensland and so was a logical target,

The location of the dam should certainly have been chosen to make the

most of the catchment and I presume that this is what the committee

should investigate. I consider it would be unwise for the committee to

ignore the experts advice on this matter and go against the decision on

purely political grounds.

As long as people flock to settle in Queensland it will requirer the

use of more and more of the assets of the state to accommodate them. $\ensuremath{\mathsf{I}}$

deplore the effect that they will have on the ecology of this area of

Queensland but I am afraid that the committee must find a way to stop

the inflow if it rules against the use of the Mary River to supply the

South Eastern part of the state.
