I am writing to express my displeasure at the handling of the Traveston Crossing Dam-Proposal. I have lived in Kandanga most of my life and at 83 years of age; I was told that I will lose my home for Community needs (the relocation of the Heritage Railway Line)

My spare block beside my home was identified as being required. After Anna Bligh said at the Gympie meeting that these were the "definitive maps" and no more maps would be going out. A week later I received another map saying that I was now losing my home. No one could tell me if I was losing both, or just the home or the just the land.

This has bought on health problems for myself. As my children live in Brisbane and I rely on others for up to date information the stress that this has caused is huge. I think the Government is misleading and have no thought for the elderly and how this affects us.

After a Community meeting for Urban Management the community decided that no homes should be lost for the relocation of Infrastructure. I had to wait a further 6 weeks before I got a letter from the Government that said that my home would be no longer required.

The Government handling of this "Damn Dam" is criminal!!
