INQUIRY INTO IMPLEMENTATION, OPERATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE LEGISLATION UNDERPINNING CARBON SINK FORESTS

Dear Secretary,

It gives me no great pleasure to announce that I as an environmental advocate for over two decades, understand most of the principles of Carbon trading, yet still have enormous concerns with the uncertainty of both the science and practical reasoning for the need.

It is in my opinion, that the problem we have created is a head in the sand mentality, totally ignoring the fact of a healthy, clean environment for future generations, versus the economic factors which in most cases benefit those who generally create the major problem in the first place.

Is it a fact that we are only fooling ourselves by introducing a feel good tax which may be flawed by the introduction of legislation that fails to understand how our unique Australian environment can remain sustainable.

The introduction of another smoke and mirrors legislation for the environment will certainly generate an army of burearocracy, yet leave a trail of destruction if not carefully and slowly introduced. As with most Federal and State environmental legislations, very few have the legislative power to enforce any breach with other newer legislations having been introduced, rendering the existing rules invalid.
