I am responding to the inquiry into beef being allowed into Australia from countries that have BSE.

I disagree with the proposal by the government to allow imported beef into Australia from countries with BSE.

I do not own cattle, however I am a concerned Australian citizen. I feel that Australia is a country where each citizen needs to stand up and support the Australian made and owned businesses, health and the future of the county, and make their views known, because the government has not as far been acting in Australia's best interest.
