

I am writing in regards to the importation of beef into Australia from countries with BSE.

We do not need to import any beef into Australia as we have enough here and it is a big export industry for us. We should be protecting Australian jobs as well as Australian's health.

We have NLIS which we had to have for traceability for each individual beast and we expect no less from any and every animal that is bought into this country. (If it's good enough for us then it's good enough for them).
