- * We live in the south west, we do't have family/friends or other accomadation that my daughter can use. How is this not living independently. Yet to qualify there are a number of time/finacial rules that are not really testing independence and the additional costs that are incurred compared to city kids who go home each nite. Get the rules correct to acheve what the allowance is meant for. In my experience may (often who least need it) are in the best position to manipulate thier finacial position to meet criteria such as this. Perhaps a staggered allowance based on distance from home.

Please genuinely look at what you are trying to achieve and the target and put rules in place that acheve this not the current set. Be good if you looked at the parent income to qualify as a dependent, If I earnt that amount I would not be able to afford alot of things and teriary education would not be funded. Your numbers are not very real
