CHAPTER ONE

THE INQUIRY

Background to the inquiry

- 1.1 The Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill 2001 ('the Bill') was introduced into the House of Representatives on 5 March 2001 by Mr Peter Andren, MP. On 27 March 2001 the Senate referred the provisions of the Bill to the Select Committee on Superannuation and Financial Services for examination and report by 23 May 2001. On 3 April, the Senate granted an extension of time in which to report to 9 August 2001.
- 1.2 The Bill, which is a private member's Bill, intends to amend the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Act 1948* to give Senators and Members of the House of Representatives the freedom to opt out of the compulsory parliamentary superannuation scheme.

Conduct of the inquiry

- 1.3 The inquiry was advertised in the *Australian Financial Review* on 20 April 2001 and in the *Weekend Australian* on 21-22 April 2001, inviting submissions by 1 June. However, in response to community interest, the Committee continued to receive submissions to 10 July. Information about the inquiry was also posted on the Committee's website.
- 1.4 On 17 May the Channel 9 TV program 'A Current Affair' canvassed community views on the issue. The Committee subsequently received more than 2,500 submissions (including over 800 standard form submissions, circulated by the proponent of the Bill, Mr Andren), 35 petitions with nearly 1500 signatures, as well as nearly 700 e-mails and other items of correspondence in relation to the Bill. Almost all were from individuals, from all States and Territories in Australia. The majority were in response to the Current Affair program, and expressed the views highlighted in that program, namely, that the parliamentary superannuation scheme was excessively generous and out of step with community standards.
- 1.5 The Committee was also criticised for advertising in papers which were not read by average Australians. The Committee points out that, with national media advertising and internet advertising, it has made effective use of the resources it has for informing the public of its inquiries, considering that it has had 13 references from the Senate and tabled 13 reports since its establishment in October 1999. Further, the Committee's 1997 inquiry into the parliamentary superannuation scheme and the judges' pension scheme, although advertised nationally and in various States daily newspapers, had elicited only 46 submissions, many of them referring only to the judges' scheme.

- 1.6 The Committee also points out that it cannot vouch for the bona fides of all correspondents and submitters as over 20 acknowledgment letters were returned as being 'unable to be delivered' or 'not known at this address'. A smaller number of the public could not initially remember signing standard form submissions or indeed writing their own.
- 1.7 A list of the submissions received is at **Appendix 1.**
- 1.8 The Committee met in public to consider the provisions of the Bill on 11 July 2001 in Sydney. Witnesses included Mr Peter Andren, MP, the proponent of the Bill, the President of the Remuneration Tribunal, representatives from the Department of Finance and Administration and the Australian Government Actuary, as well as the peak industry body, the Association of Superannuation Funds of Australia (ASFA). The Committee also conducted a forum in which seven representatives from all over Australia participated, four in person and three by teleconference.
- 1.9 A list of witnesses who gave evidence at the public hearing is at **Appendix 2**.
- 1.10 Processing the enormous number of submissions, correspondence, e-mails and petitions was very resource and time consuming. The Committee acknowledges the assistance provided by the following officers in the Department of the Senate: Chris Hall, Jacquie Hawkins, Debbie McMahon, Angela Mututu, Doreen Russell, Emma Will and Chris Wilson.
- 1.11 The Committee also acknowledges the contribution to the inquiry of Sue Morton, the Committee Secretary, and the other members of the secretariat, Peter Crawford and Jade Ricza.

CHAPTER TWO

THE BILL

Background to the Bill

- 2.1 In November 1996, the Senate referred 'the appropriateness of the current unfunded defined benefit superannuation schemes application to judges and parliamentarians' to the (then) Senate Select Committee on Superannuation. The Committee tabled its report titled *The Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Scheme & the Judges' Pension Scheme* in September 1997.
- 2.2 The Committee concluded in its 1997 report that:
- change to the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Scheme (PCSS) was desirable;
- the scheme was out of step with superannuation practice in the wider community;
- there was convincing evidence that it was excessively generous to a small group of retiring parliamentarians; and
- there was a lack of transparency in parliamentary superannuation, and that this lack of transparency gave rise to much of the criticism of the PCSS. ¹
- 2.3 On 1 December 1997, the Government responded to the report. The Minister for Finance wrote that the Government welcomed the report and noted that Committee members were all of the view that the Remuneration Tribunal should be involved in setting parliamentary superannuation. The Minister continued that the Government would give further consideration to the Committee's findings in the context of changes then proposed for parliamentary salaries.
- 2.4 In subsequent correspondence on 20 June 2000, the Minister responded to the Committee's request for advice concerning the Government's intention to make any further changes to the superannuation arrangements for parliamentarians. The Minister advised that the Government would give further consideration to parliamentary superannuation arrangements in due course. The Minister also pointed out that the Remuneration Tribunal had stated in its report of 7 December 1999 that it was satisfied that the total remuneration package for Senators and Members, including the recent salary increase and superannuation, was competitive.
- 2.5 On 12 November 1998, the Minister for Financial Services & Regulation the Hon. Joe Hockey, MP introduced the Superannuation Legislation Amendment

(Choice of Superannuation Funds) Bill 1998. That Bill proposed to amend the *Superannuation Guarantee (Administration) Act 1992* to give ordinary employees a choice as to which fund their superannuation contributions are paid. It also reflects the Government's policy direction for the community, although it does not apply to the PCSS.

2.6 Against this background, on 5 March 2001 Mr Peter Andren introduced the Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill 2001, which is the subject of this inquiry. The rationale, as stated in the Explanatory Memorandum, was as follows:

Despite a Senate Inquiry in 1997 which concluded the parliamentary scheme lacks transparency, is out of step with superannuation practice in the wider community and is in some cases excessively generous, there appears to be no will on the part of the Government or Opposition to reform the scheme.²

- 2.7 At the public hearing, Mr Andren amplified his reasons for the Bill. He touched on the 'indefensible generosity of the parliamentary superannuation scheme' and noted that:
- its totally unfunded nature was a gradually increasing, and totally unwarranted, liability on future taxpayers;
- choice was increasingly available in the community as well as being Government policy; and
- the opportunity to opt out would enable those parliamentarians wishing to preserve their integrity and honour to do so.

Developments since the introduction of the Bill

- 2.8 In response to the flood of submissions and the views expressed, the Committee wrote to the Prime Minister on 19 June 2001 drawing his attention to the nature and level of community concern; particularly about the level of employer contribution and the access to benefits before 55 years of age.
- 2.9 The Government responded by introducing a Bill on 27 June which, on 27 and 28 June 2001, the Parliament enacted as the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Amendment Act 2001*. This Act now provides that the payment of parliamentary pensions for new Senators and Members of Parliament will be deferred until they reach 55, become invalids or die. In addition, the Act provides that the right to choose to commute part of the pension benefit to a lump sum is also deferred to age 55.

2.10 Although this development addresses one of the major concerns raised during the inquiry, it has had a mixed reception with some commentators, such as Mr Daryl Dixon, referring to it as 'a band-aid measure'.³

Current arrangements

- 2.11 In order to put the proposed amendments into context, an outline of the current arrangements follows.
- 2.12 The current superannuation arrangements for Senators and Members are that they automatically become members of the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Scheme from the time that they first become entitled to a parliamentary salary. 4
- 2.13 The PCSS is a defined benefit superannuation scheme. The scheme is unfunded. Members' contributions are a fixed percentage (usually 11.5%) of parliamentary salaries (including any additional salary for service as a Minister or an office holder in the Parliament) and are paid to the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth meets the full cost of PCSS benefits when they are paid.
- 2.14 The essence of qualification for a pension is 12 years for voluntary retirement and eight years for those who retire involuntarily. Four and three parliamentary terms respectively equate to those periods of 12 and eight years.
- 2.15 The primary benefit under the PCSS is a pension, although up to 50% of a pension (other than an invalidity pension) can be commuted to a lump sum benefit. The minimum pension is 50% of the basic salary (usually paid either on involuntary retirement with eight years service or on voluntary retirement with 12 years service) and the maximum pension is 75% of the basic salary available on retirement with 18 years or more service. There is an additional pension payable for any Ministerial and salaried parliamentary offices held. Parliamentary pensions are reduced, in certain circumstances, where the recipient holds an office of profit under the Crown.
- 2.16 However, not all retiring members qualify for a pension. Those who do not qualify for a pension are entitled to a lump sum comprising the higher of:
- a refund of contributions plus a supplement;

(for voluntary retirement the supplement is 1 1/6 times the contributions, and where it is involuntary, the supplement is 2 1/3 times the contributions)

or:

• a lump sump representing the Superannuation Guarantee 'safety net'.

This section draws principally from the submission from the Department of Finance and Administration, Submission No. 2621.

- 2.17 The current PCSS provides, as the Superannuation Guarantee 'safety net', a benefit generally equivalent to the Superannuation Guarantee (SG) minimum together with a refund of member contributions, all accumulated with interest. The 'safety net' amount is calculated on the following basis:
- where the person had been a Senator or Member continuously since 30 June 1992 the voluntary retirement lump sum benefit of 2 1/6 times their own contributions as at that date, plus
- the Senator or Member's own contributions due to parliamentary service after 30 June 1992, plus
- the SG employer contributions due to parliamentary service after 30 June 1992, plus
- interest on the above amounts at the Public Sector Superannuation Scheme crediting rate.
- 2.18 Reversionary benefits are paid to eligible spouses or eligible children on the death of a Senator or Member or a former Senator or Member entitled to a pension from the PCSS.
- 2.19 PCSS benefits are subject to the same tax, including the superannuation surcharge, and the preservation standards that apply to superannuation payments generally.
- 2.20 A Quick Reference Guide to the Main Provisions of the PCSS, published by the Department of Finance and Administration, is at **Appendix 3**. The Handbook on the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Scheme together with the Quick Reference Guide may be accessed on the Departmental website at: http://www.finance.gov.au/super/parliamentary_superannuation.htm.
- 2.21 Under the most recent changes to the scheme, pensions payable to new Senator and Members elected on or after the next general election will not become payable until they reach age 55, become invalids or die.

Parliamentarians accessing pensions

- 2.22 Data from the Parliamentary Library indicates that, as at 20 July 2001, the average length of service of current Senators is 9 years, of Members of the House of Representatives is 8.1 years, giving an average length of service of both Senators and Members of 8.4 years. Although the average of 8.4 years is more than the 8 years minimum to qualify (in some circumstances) for a pension, other information is available to determine the actual numbers of ex-Senators and Members who did qualify.
- 2.23 According to the Parliamentary Handbook database, as at 20 July 2001, there are 367 former Senators and Members still living. Of these, 226 are receiving a

pension from the scheme.⁵ However, some former Senators and Members may not be receiving a pension because, although qualifying for a pension, they have commuted 100% of their pension to a lump sum.⁶

2.24 From these facts and figures it appears that 141 ex-contributors are not receiving a pension. But this figure must be adjusted for those who commuted 100% of their pension. It has not been possible to determine how many commuted 100% of their pension, although, in 1996, there were at least 33 (those who had qualifying spouses) who had so commuted. It seems, therefore, that about 108 out of 367 living ex-Senators and Members (29%) failed to qualify for a pension under the PCSS. This means that approximately 70% qualified for a pension.

Summary of proposed amendments

2.25 The Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill 2001 would allow new Senators and Members (elected after the Bill is passed) to choose to have employer contributions paid by the Commonwealth to a complying superannuation fund or Retirement Savings Account (RSA) of their choice, instead of becoming or continuing as a member of the PCSS. A complying superannuation fund is a superannuation fund or scheme that is eligible for concessional tax treatment if it satisfies certain conditions specified in the Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993. Such schemes are generally regulated superannuation funds, although an exempt public sector superannuation scheme like the PCSS is taken to be a complying superannuation fund for tax purposes. RSAs are offered to the general public by financial institutions like banks, building societies, credit unions and life insurance companies and are intended to provide a simple low cost, low risk savings product, which has a generally lower return, which employers can use to make SG contributions. RSAs are treated in a similar manner to complying superannuation funds in respect of taxation and prudential supervision.

2.26 Under the proposed amendments, a new Senator or Member would be allowed to opt out of the PCSS on first becoming a Senator or Member or at any time while

contributing to the PCSS. Employer contributions would be at the Superannuation Guarantee rate (currently 8% of ordinary times earnings rising to 9% in 2002-03). A new member opting out of the current PCSS would be able to make personal contributions to their chosen fund or RSA, but this would not be compulsory.

- 2.27 The right to choose not to contribute to the PCSS would be a once only option. Once the election to opt out of the PCSS was made it could not be revoked by either continuing members or members who leave Parliament and later return.
- 2.28 A PCSS member who ceases to contribute to that scheme would receive their accrued PCSS benefit and no other benefit. For this purpose, the accrued benefit would be the SG safety-net amount from the PCSS. This would be the case whether or not the Senator or Member has sufficient service to have qualified for a pension on leaving the PCSS. According to the Explanatory Memorandum on the Bill it is intended that this benefit must be rolled over to the Senator or Member's chosen fund or RSA
- 2.29 The Bill would allow the same arrangements that apply to new Senators and Members to be made available to existing Senators and Members.

Technical and other deficiencies of the Bill

- 2.30 The Committee notes that, in evidence to the inquiry, the Department of Finance and Administration drew attention to some technical deficiencies in the present Bill. These included the need to:
- authorise contributions by the Commonwealth at the SG minimum rate;
- revise those clauses which assume contributions are made to the Parliamentary Retiring Allowances Trust, whereas they are in fact paid to the Commonwealth; and
- avoid a perhaps unintended consequence of disentitling some members from a reversionary benefit.
- 2.31 The Department also noted that the Bill was silent on the framework in which choice will be applied to Senators and Members.⁸
- 2.32 The Committee also notes that the Bill does not appear to provide for same sex couples.
- 2.33 When these matters were drawn to the attention of Mr Andren at the public hearing, he assured the Committee that he foresaw no difficulty with appropriate necessary amendments.

2.34 The Committee notes that, in the context of consideration of this Bill, the question of the constitutional validity of the underlying legislation of the PCSS was raised. While the High Court alone can rule on this, the Committee understands that this issue has occasionally arisen in the past and that weight of advice has consistently been in favour of validity.

CHAPTER THREE

ISSUES

Introduction

3.1 A number of issues were raised during the inquiry which highlight the need for change of the PCSS and the direction which that change should take. One major criticism of the PCSS has since been addressed – the criticism that parliamentarians had immediate access to their pension on finishing their parliamentary careers instead of having to wait until age 55 or later as is the case for the general community. However, deferral until age 55 has now been achieved by the enactment the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Amendment Act 2001*.

The need for change

- 3.2 The former Select Committee on Superannuation in its 1997 report pointed out that the scheme had many significant shortcomings. It did not necessarily serve all its members well, might be outdated in some of its provisions and attempted to achieve too much in relation to what a superannuation scheme could fairly be expected to provide. In the light of these findings the 1997 Committee considered that reform was desirable.¹
- 3.3 Not unexpectedly, those making submissions to this inquiry into the Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill 2001 expressed similar views.

Lack of equity

- 3.4 The majority of submissions and witnesses argued for change on the grounds of equity, citing the following differences between parliamentary superannuation and superannuation for everyone else:
- 69% employer contribution compared with a minimum of 8% for the wider community;² and
- access to a full benefit after 8-12 years of service compared with the 20 -30 years in some other public sector schemes.
- 3.5 There was also criticism of the parliamentarians' immediate access to superannuation instead of waiting until 55 years of age or later. However, as previously explained, pensions for new parliamentarians, elected in the next general election, will now be deferred until age 55. The Committee understands that in some

sectors, including the private sector, some people can access their pensions earlier than 55.

3.6 On grounds of equity, many submissions were critical of the benefits (superannuation and other) paid to former Senators and Members (especially travel benefits).

Lack of transparency

- 3.7 Many submissions and the witnesses at the public hearing complained of the lack of transparency of the scheme. However, the Committee noted that details about the PCSS are on the internet, including the Act itself, a leaflet and a handbook about the scheme.³ In comparison, details about superannuation schemes in the private corporate sector are much more difficult to obtain. While access to this information on the internet is not ideal (as not everyone has access to the internet), it does go some way towards improving the transparency of the scheme.
- 3.8 Criticism of the scheme as lacking in transparency, however, does not recognise that the move to accrual accounting in the national accounts has made the unfunded liability of the scheme more transparent.

Lack of alignment with community standards and expectations

- 3.9 Much of the evidence drew attention to not only the unfunded liability of the present scheme but also the need for the scheme to be more in keeping with community standards and expectations. The Committee discussed with various witnesses at the public hearing what might be meant by community standards and expectations. It was seen that different interest groups define community standards differently. There was general recognition that not all groups in the community should be treated the same, that special arrangements were appropriate for certain categories of people, for example, defence personnel and police.
- 3.10 Examining the issue from a different perspective the Committee sought from various witnesses, without success, the justification for paying to any person in the community a rate in excess of the minimum employer superannuation contribution guaranteed under the law. It would seem that some circumstances (such as dangerous duty in the case of defence or police personnel) may justify higher superannuation but there was no consensus on what constitutes a community standard or the principles for determining it.

Lack of appropriate remuneration

3.11 Some people, in evidence to the Committee, recognised that remuneration for parliamentarians should be appropriate. However, while there was a case to increase remuneration, they did not consider that the superannuation arrangements should remain so generous.

The direction of reform

- 3.12 In its 1997 report, all members of the former Committee were of the view that the Remuneration Tribunal should play a greater role in respect of parliamentary superannuation, though opinions differed on the nature and extent of that role.⁴
- 3.13 The directions for reform which were canvassed in the former Committee's 1997 report were again raised in evidence before the Committee. They included:
- opting out of the present scheme;
- increasing the flexibility of the present arrangements;
- moving to a funded accumulation scheme; and
- determining parliamentary superannuation.

Opting out

- 3.14 Although the standard form submissions supported the Bill as the first step in reforming the PCSS, by far the majority of submissions did not specifically comment on the Bill itself nor the major thrust of the Bill: giving the freedom to opt out of the present scheme.
- 3.15 Of those that did, most saw the choice as farcical or unreal: 'Asking Members to opt out of their own little goldmine of a super scheme is like asking children to opt out of eating the lollies you have just bought them...It is the silliest of Bills, the choice being asked for is a farce.'5
- 3.16 One submission suggested that comparisons with existing legislative minimums were unfair, as these arrangements were unlikely to apply to managers, and in any event were not sufficient to provide for a living wage in retirement. The submission also stated that it was unrealistic to expect such a complete disregard for their own self-interest from any group in society. Further, the only incumbents likely to opt out of the PCSS were those who felt under threat from an independent running against them in a close election.⁶

Coalition members of that Committee concluded that the issue of superannuation must be considered as part of parliamentary remuneration determined by the Remuneration Tribunal with direction from Government about a number of factors to be considered. Labor Senators saw the Remuneration Tribunal as the appropriate body to make necessary recommendations for reform in light of its independence, experience with remuneration matters and its ability to evaluate the totality of the scheme and its objectives. The Australian Democrats' dissenting report recommended that the Remuneration Tribunal should be asked to determine an appropriate, reduced level of superannuation benefits for parliamentarians, taking into account standards prevailing in the community at large and the unusual nature of parliamentary life.

- 3.17 Opting out was seen as a possible direction for reform but there were drawbacks such as:
- few would choose it;
- some might be unfairly pressured to do so: matching promises to opt out by other candidates in a tight election in a marginal seat;
- it would perhaps enable some parliamentarians to increase their take home pay at the expense of investing in further superannuation;
- while in the long term, it would ultimately be a saving, in the short term, the Commonwealth would have to pay out immediately the accrued entitlements of present contributors; and
- it does not solve the problems associated with the present scheme for those who remain in it.
- 3.18 The Bill was seen as not offering a viable choice. There was, however, no consensus on what the appropriate alternative to the PCSS should be. A number of alternatives were suggested but none differed markedly from those canvassed in the Committee's 1997 report.⁷
- 3.19 During the hearing, the Committee's attention was drawn to suggestions made in a recent article by Mr Daryl Dixon that the total remuneration package procedures adopted for all NSW Government Senior Executive Officers could provide a useful model.⁸ In the same article, Mr Dixon suggested that the parliamentary pension plan required serious modifications to reflect the true actuarial costs of the benefits. He also suggested that, to achieve fairness between all MPs, old and new, a restructure of current remuneration arrangements was required.

Increasing the flexibility of the present arrangements

- 3.20 The lack of flexibility in the PCSS was discussed in the 1997 report as one of the flaws of the scheme:
- some older parliamentarians will not recover their contributions as benefits before they die, particularly if they retire at or after 60 and choose a pension over a lump sum. Nonetheless, these members are compelled to continue contributing to the scheme;
- some members may wish to provide better cover for spouses and children or other dependants, or to enhance their benefits by contributing at a higher rate. They are unable to do so within the scheme under current rules; and

- anomalous situations exist whereby:
 - a person who enters the Parliament later in life and who has already accrued a substantial superannuation benefit from previous employment is none the less required to contribute to the fund; and
 - such persons may even fall foul of reasonable benefit limits and be subjected to penalty rates of taxation, through no fault of their own.
- 3.21 To address these and other issues, at the public hearing, the President of the Remuneration Tribunal supported the concept of greater flexibility within the context of a total remuneration package. He indicated that many new members of Parliament required increased flexibility given age, gender and circumstances and that a less rigid approach to the whole process would be preferable in the longer term. On the matter of flexibility, he further explained:

how do we explore ways of providing greater flexibility for those who need it in parliament? Many of the determinations historically have been brought in in an environment where you have a married male member of parliament with 2.5 children, and they are geared to that type of situation. Many members of parliament now may be unmarried, they may have partners of either sex, or they may have other needs which require them to have some flexibility in their remuneration.

. . .

The idea I have is that, as far as possible, I am interested in providing the maximum amount of flexibility consistent with good management principles.¹⁰

Moving to a funded accumulation scheme

- 3.22 During the previous inquiry the (then) Department of Finance advised the Committee that, in relation to the PCSS, member choice of fund and investment were not really practical under the defined benefit arrangement. Evidence to that inquiry suggested that, if greater choice of scheme or investment policy were required, then it would seem appropriate to move to a fully funded accumulation scheme as opposed to the current unfunded scheme.
- 3.23 Most of the evidence to the current inquiry, that commented on the issue, also made the suggestion of moving to a funded accumulation scheme because of the cost to the taxpayer if the excessively generous unfunded liabilities were to continue.
- 3.24 It was pointed out that an accumulation scheme could offer members improved flexibility, within the context of a total remuneration package arrangement. Under such an arrangement, a parliamentarian could, as in the private sector, negotiate

a total package, including an appropriate level of superannuation, according to individual requirements. However, such an arrangement is not currently available to parliamentarians under the PCSS.

3.25 The President of the Remuneration Tribunal saw the move to a funded scheme as the way forward:

If one is going to reform the system, and if that is really what is being envisaged, then one would have to approach it at a more holistic level. That would, in fact, involve superannuation arrangements in which people make contributions to accumulation funds, as they do in the rest of the community.¹¹

Determining parliamentary superannuation

- 3.26 The Committee was greatly concerned indeed embarrassed at being asked to review their own entitlements, as inevitably, charges of conflict of interest will arise. Many submissions mentioned this conflict of interest in one way or another. The Committee agrees that parliamentarians are not the most appropriate persons to determine their own superannuation.
- 3.27 Many submissions suggested an independent body would be a more suitable body to determine parliamentary superannuation. There were arguments for and against the Remuneration Tribunal being the most suitable body. Some submissions perceived the Remuneration Tribunal as not sufficiently distant from Parliament to be completely impartial. At the public hearing, Mr Andren based his opposition to a role for the Tribunal on the fact that 'on 7 December 1999 the Tribunal reported that it was satisfied that the remuneration package for Senators and Members that is, salaries, superannuation and vehicle is now competitive'. He was not confident that the Remuneration Tribunal was necessarily the best body to take on this role, given that it is already on record as saying that the overall package is adequate. ¹²
- 3.28 Mr Andren suggested as an alternative a committee chaired by a person of the eminence of the former Governor-General, with the superannuation industry represented, as well as a lay person and an ordinary employer.
- 3.29 Generally, however, submissions on this issue favoured the Remuneration Tribunal as the appropriate body. The President of the Remuneration Tribunal pointed to the fragmented environment caused by the way things have developed with one Act governing superannuation, another dealing with remuneration and other allowances ultimately approved by the Special Minister of State. He favoured a holistic approach which would take all elements into consideration and also provide flexibility to meet the different circumstances of parliamentarians. The Remuneration Tribunal advised that it would welcome the opportunity to be involved in determining

the total package applying to parliamentarians in order to achieve a coherent and consistent approach.

3.30 The Committee notes that, on 26 June, the Minister for Finance and Administration announced that he will be requesting the Remuneration Tribunal to consider the provision of a redundancy type benefit, limited to new Senators and Members who may require assistance to establish themselves in the workforce. The Tribunal has not yet received a formal referral from the Minister but it is within the Tribunal's powers under the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973* to inquire into and to determine that members of Parliament receive redundancy type benefits when they are not re-elected. The Remuneration Tribunal will be proceeding on this reference as soon as they receive it.

CHAPTER FOUR

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

- 4.1 The Committee welcomes the impetus generated by the introduction of the Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill 2001 towards contributing to the debate on parliamentary superannuation. The level of the response from the community reflects the degree of concern about this issue with the majority arguing for politicians to be treated the same as everybody else. Some supported the passage of the Bill as a first step towards achieving this.
- 4.2 The rationale for the Bill highlights a number of issues which were identified in the former Committee's 1997 report and which are still of obvious concern.
- 4.3 While the Bill contains some technical and other deficiencies, the Committee is of the view that, with good will on behalf of the Government, appropriate amendments could be incorporated to overcome these. Mr Andren foresaw no major difficulty in relation to such amendments to his Bill.
- 4.4 The Committee also welcomes the passage of the Government's *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Amendment Act 2001*. The Act addresses one of the major concerns raised during the inquiry by providing that the payment of parliamentary pensions for new Senators and Members of Parliament will be deferred until they reach 55, become invalids or die.
- 4.5 In both the 1997 inquiry and this inquiry, the need for change of the PCSS focussed on four major issues, namely:
- lack of equity;
- lack of alignment with community standards and expectations;
- lack of transparency; and
- lack of appropriate remuneration.
- 4.6 After reviewing the evidence, the Committee sees no reason to depart from the conclusions which the former Committee expressed in the 1997 report.
- 4.7 With the only change since 1997 being the recent deferral of access to pension until age 55, the Committee reiterates that:
- change to the PCSS is desirable, particularly because of the inequities which still exist and the convincing evidence that it is still excessively generous to a small group of retiring parliamentarians; and

- the scheme is still out of step with superannuation practice in the wider community and does not reflect community standards and expectations, however defined.
- 4.8 Whilst the scheme has been criticised for a lack of transparency, this lack of transparency continues to give rise to much of the criticism of the PCSS. In the Committee's view, the lack of transparency may be more a question of perception than reality. Through the internet, information about the scheme is now more readily available, if not universally accessible.
- 4.9 The Committee considers that there has been an improvement in transparency with the adoption of accrual budgetting. The Committee supports moving to a funded scheme, even if as a transitional measure it is a trust account within the Commonwealth.
- 4.10 The Committee is of the view that superannuation for parliamentarians needs to be considered in the context of an overall remuneration package.
- 4.11 The Committee, recognising the criticism that the old scheme needs to be brought up to date, notes that there are a number of options for reform of the PCSS and that opting out as proposed by this Bill is one of these options. The Committee considers that the option of opting out is not the best way forward as not only does it not solve the problems associated with the present scheme but it also brings problems of its own, such as a member in a marginal seat being held to ransom to opt out. Accordingly, the Committee does not support the Bill.
- 4.12 The Committee notes that, while they must contribute, parliamentarians are free not to receive the benefits available to them under the PCSS. This option exists even without the Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill.
- 4.13 The Committee has long held the view that there is a need for greater flexibility in the scheme. The Committee welcomes the holistic approach proposed by the Remuneration Tribunal to increase the flexibility of the scheme in the context of a remuneration package comprising superannuation, remuneration and allowances. This approach would address the need that many new members of Parliament have for greater flexibility given their age, gender and circumstances as well as enabling a consistent and cohesive policy to be in place.
- 4.14 The Committee recognises that there are different views in the community as to which is the most appropriate body to determine parliamentary superannuation. However, the Committee considers that the Remuneration Tribunal, because of its independence, broad experience and access to information to all the factors which may affect determinations, is the most appropriate body.
- 4.15 The Committee considers that the Government should confer on the Remuneration Tribunal the power, through legislative amendments if necessary, to deal with the matter of parliamentary superannuation in the context of a consolidated package for parliamentarians which would comprise salaries, superannuation and

allowances and which would be administered by the Department of Finance and Administration.

Recommendation

4.16 The Committee recommends that, in order to achieve a cohesive and consistent approach, the issue of parliamentary superannuation be considered by the Remuneration Tribunal as part of a consolidated package comprising salaries, superannuation and allowances.

DISSENTING REPORT AUSTRALIAN DEMOCRATS SENATOR LYN ALLISON

The Democrats support the intent of the Parliamentary (Choice of Superannuation) Bill 2001 and have moved amendments twice in the Senate which would put it into effect.

The Democrats' history on seeking to reform the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Act 1948* is longstanding and we initiated the inquiry into Parliamentary Superannuation that resulted in the report of September 1997.

We said in that report that the scheme was too generous, fails the test of fairness and was in urgent need of reform.

Since then legislation has been passed which preserves benefits for parliamentarians elected at the next election to age 55 but this is a long way short of the reform that is needed.

It is difficult to assess the level of generosity of the scheme because the benefit varies according to the years of service of the parliamentarian. However, the Government Actuary has reported that the "notional employer contribution" was 69.1 per cent as at 30 June 1996. The Actuary calculated this notional contribution as the effective cost of the benefits as a percentage of the total salaries of scheme members, but did not calculate how much of this was funded by the parliamentarian's own contributions and how much was funded by public subsidies.

We did attempt to estimate the public subsidy and found that the ratios of employer to member contributions were around 8 times for 8 years of service, 6 for 12 years, 5 for 18 years and 3 for 24 years. By any measure these are excessive subsidies. Preservation to age 55 would reduce this subsidy although that will not take effect for some time into the future.

This Bill would simply provide parliamentarians with the option of exiting this generous scheme and having contributions made to a complying superannuation fund of their choice. The contributions would be equal to the current Superannuation Guarantee of 8 per cent of ordinary times earnings.

The legislation has been criticised by many submissions to the inquiry for the fact that it is optional. Whilst we don't believe it is a farce as some submissions have suggested, we don't think it is fair or reasonable to put parliamentarians individually in the position of making that decision and we think the general public would be very sceptical about such an arrangement.

It is however almost impossible for Opposition Members and Senators to introduce or amend legislation to fold the existing scheme and set up an accumulation scheme and so we are left with little opportunity to put in place a scheme which truly reflects community standards.

The Democrats have put amendments to recent legislation on parliamentary superannuation which would reduce contributions for all parliamentarians so they are at least more in line with the rates set by the public service. These amendments were not supported by the Coalition or the ALP.

The Democrats hold the view that arguments for special arrangements for parliamentarians are without merit and that community standards in the form of SG contributions to an accumulation scheme should be the benchmark. We do not believe it is valid to argue that higher levels of superannuation are justified to prop up what is said to be an inadequate salary.

In 1997 we recommended that the Remuneration Tribunal should be asked to determine an appropriate, reduced level of superannuation benefits for parliamentarians, taking into account standards prevailing in the community at large and the unusual nature of parliamentary life.

We also argued that salary packaging and total remuneration packaging approaches be rejected for parliamentarians' remuneration, with each element of remuneration being separately assessed as being appropriate and fair for its relevant purpose.

We also made a number of recommendations to improve the scheme and to make it more equitable for parliamentarians across the board. These recommendations included consideration of a redundancy function separate from the retirement function, a review of the rules for survivor and invalidity benefits and allowing parliamentarians to make additional contributions if they so wish.

The Committee's Report of the inquiry in 1997 into Parliamentary Superannuation said that change to the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Scheme was desirable and that the scheme was out of step with superannuation practice in the wider community. "There is convincing evidence that it is excessively generous to a small group of retiring parliamentarians."

The Democrats are of the view that the recently passed reform to preserve entitlements to age 55 for new parliamentarians does not go far enough. We support this Bill although it too does not constitute proper reform of the system.

PARLIAMENTARY CONTRIBUTORY SUPERANNUATION SCHEME

A QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE TO THE MAIN PROVISIONS

The legislative basis for the Scheme is the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Act 1948 (the Act); this pamphlet has no legal authority.

July 2001

MEMBERSHIP

Membership of the scheme is compulsory for all Senators and Members.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions are a fixed percentage of the parliamentary allowance (ie backbench salary) and any additional salary payable for service as an office holder of the parliament. These rates are:

- $11\frac{1}{2}$ % of parliamentary allowance until the completion of 18 years service: and
- 5³/₄ % of parliamentary allowance after the completion of 18 years service.

These rates also apply to any additional salary.

BENEFITS

If retirement is <u>voluntary</u>, a Senator or Member is entitled to a retiring allowance (ie parliamentary pension) after completing 12 or more years service or if he or she has ceased to be a member on 4 occasions. (An "occasion" occurs on the dissolution or expiration of the relevant House or the expiration of a Senator's or Member's term of office.)

If retirement is <u>involuntary</u> (eg due to the loss of preselection or loss at an election), a Senator or Member is entitled to a retiring allowance if he or she has 8 or more years' service or if he or she has ceased to be a member on 3 occasions

(Senators who have 6 year terms achieve an "occasion" after the completion of 3 years of that term, as well as when the term expires.)

Senators and Members who do not qualify for a retiring allowance under these conditions may be entitled to a retiring allowance if the Parliamentary Retiring Allowances Trust (the Trust) is satisfied that the retirement is due to ill-health.

Where a Senator or Member does not become entitled to a retiring allowance he or she is entitled to a lump sum comprising the higher of:

• a refund of contributions plus a supplement;

for voluntary retirement the supplement is 1 1/6 times the contributions, and where it is involuntary, the supplement is 2 1/3 times the contributions: or;

• a lump sum representing the Superannuation Guarantee minimum.

Benefits are reduced to take account of the superannuation contributions <u>surcharge</u>.

Between the completion of 8 and 18 years service each additional day's service attracts an additional retiring allowance of 0.00685% of the parliamentary allowance.

Additional retiring allowance in respect of office holder service accrues at the rate of 6.25% of the additional salary for each year the office is held, up to a maximum of 75% for the highest paying office held, ie each day as an office holder attract a benefit of 0.0171% of additional salary.

Retiring allowances for Senators and Members elected at or after the 2001 general election become payable at age 55 or on invalidity or death.

Retiring allowances are increased in line with <u>increases</u> in parliamentary salaries.

COMMUTATION

Former Senators and Members who become entitled to a retiring allowance, except by reason of ill health, may commute up to 50 percent of the retiring allowance to a lump sum.

The lump sum is equal to the annual amount of retiring allowance commuted multiplied by the commutation factor. The commutation factor for ages up to and including 65 years is 10. The commutation factor reduces by 0.5 per year and reduces to zero at age 85. Examples of the commutation factor applicable at various ages are set out below:

AGE	FACTOR
65 or less	10.0
70	7.5
75	5.0
80	2.5
85 or over	0.0

SPOUSE BENEFITS

An annuity is payable to the spouse of a Senator or Member who dies in service irrespective of length of service.

An annuity is payable to the spouse of a former Senator or Member if the marital relationship commenced before retirement from the Parliament. An annuity is also payable where the marital relationship commenced after retirement from the Parliament provided that it commenced before the former member was aged 60 or at least 5 years before his or her death.

A spouse's annuity is 5/6 of a former member's retiring allowance. Where the annuity becomes payable to the spouse of a serving Member or Senator who died with less than 8 years service, the spouse's annuity is based on the benefit which would have been payable had 8 years service been completed.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS APPLYING IN SOME CIRCUMSTANCES

Where former Senators and Members who are entitled to a retiring allowance or their spouses who receive an annuity hold an <u>office of profit</u> under the crown, their benefit may be reduced. The retiring allowance or annuity is reduced above a threshold of 20% of backbench salary at the rate of 50 cents in the dollar. A maximum reduction of 50% of the retiring allowance <u>before commutation</u> applies.

Special provisions also apply to former Senators and Members who are re-elected to the Commonwealth Parliament or are elected to State or Territory legislatures, and to current Senators and Members who have received, or are entitled to receive, lump sum benefits under other superannuation schemes (including State or Territory parliamentary schemes).

ADMINISTRATION

The scheme is administered by the Parliamentary Retiring Allowances Trust. The Department of Finance and Administration undertake the day-to-day administration.

A person affected by a decision of the Trust may request within 30 days of being notified of that decision, or in whatever time the Trust considers reasonable, that the Trust reconsider the matter. Further recourse to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal is available.
